MEASURE	DESCRIPTION AND HOW IT WAS CALCULATED
Graduation Rate	Assessment through Comprehensive Written Examination (Direct Measure). Formula for Calculation: Graduation Rate = $\frac{\text{No. of students Graduated (without backlogs within 6 months of minimum duration of completion of program)}}{\text{No. of students enrolled in the program} - \text{No. of Students dropped/transferred}}$ This is conducted at the end of every semester (Summative assessment). For Core and major specialization courses a three-hour written examination for 100 marks is conducted. For minor specializations, the examinations would be for 50 marks and for two-hour duration. The examination marks later converted into a weightage of 50 and 25 for core / major and minor subjects respectively. Except Comprehensive Written Examinations, each program has its own formative assessment system (including other direct and indirect measures) which carries respectively weightage of 50 marks and 25 marks for core and minor courses. While the public disclosure statement publishes the overall pass percentage in each program, the detail awarded marks in both summative and formative assessments are not published in any public domain. Question Paper Setting: The university examination department issues notice to the faculty concerned and asks for submission of TWO SETS of question papers for each course. Later, the examination department constitutes 'Board of Domain/Subject Experts' to review the quality of question papers. It is the Board's discretion to select anyone from the submitted sets of question papers as final question paper or the board may frame another set by selecting questions from each set of submitted papers by the question paper setter. The major responsibilities of the Board are as follows: (i) To check and ensure whether all relevant IACBE-ISLOs are adequately addressed by the questions. (ii) (ii) To check and ensure whether all relevant Course Outcomes / Program Outcomes and Bloom's Taxonomy Levels are addressed in the question paper
